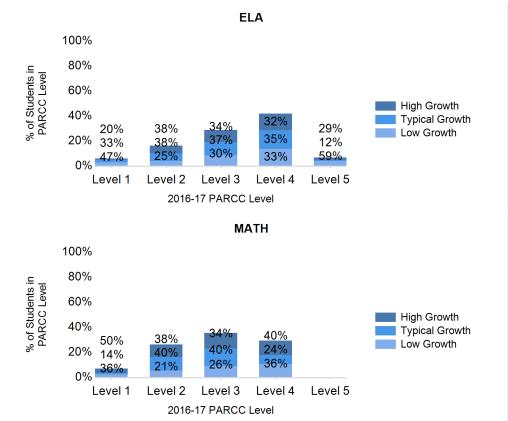

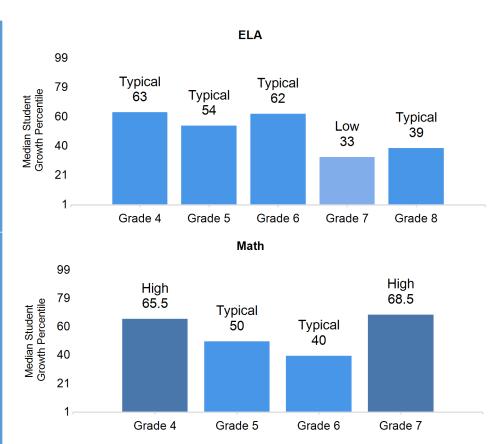
Student Growth by Performance Level

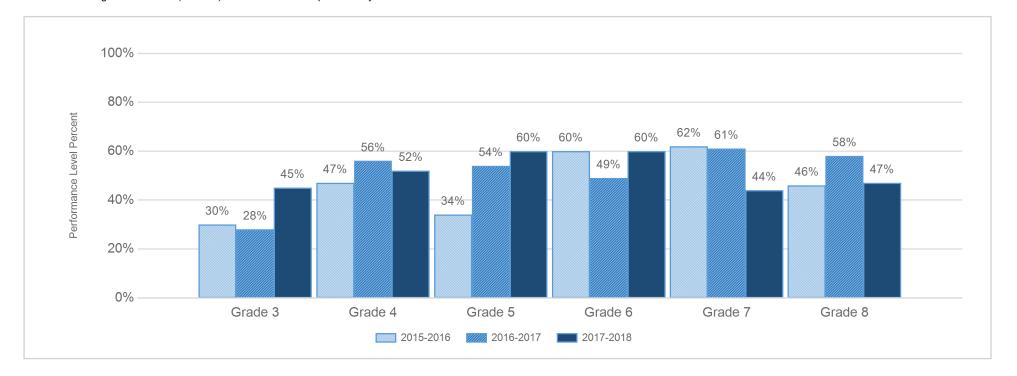

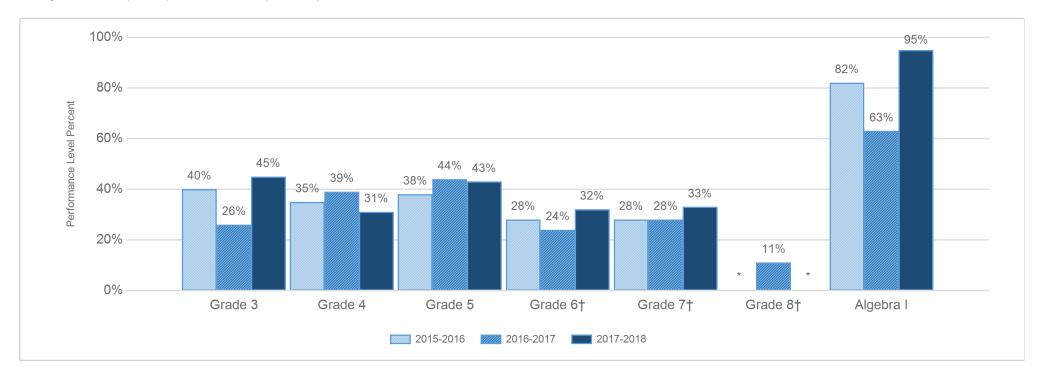

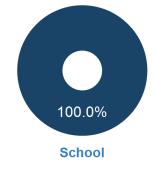

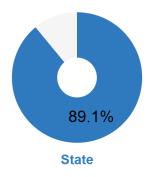

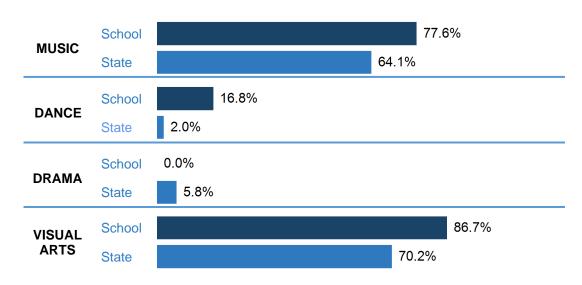


Students enrolled in one or more visual and performing arts classes

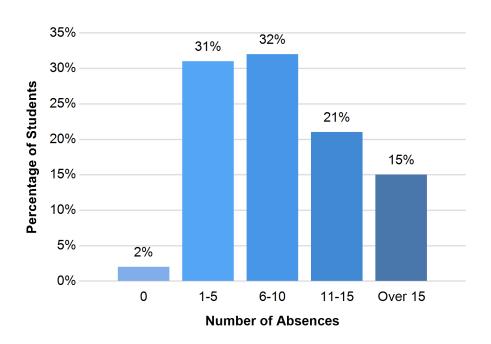

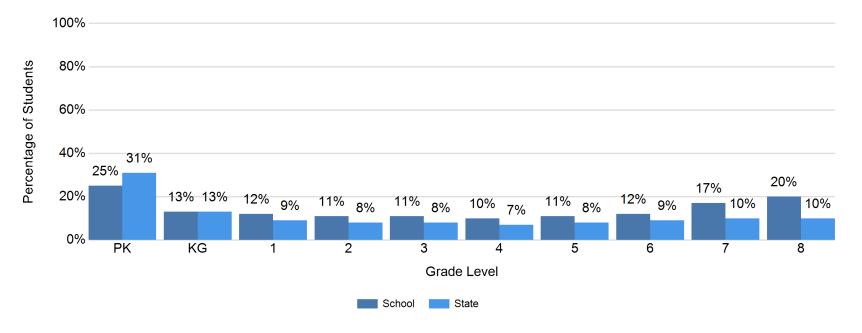

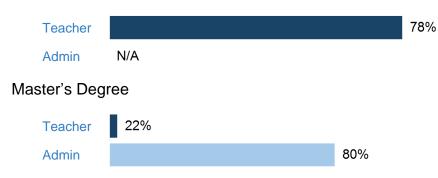
